IACS Overview

- Individuals Authorized Access to the CMS Computer Services (IACS) allows user to apply a single User ID to access many CMS applications
- An IACS account is required to access the GPRO Web Interface (WI)
- Users are limited to one IACS account per person
 - An existing IACS account cannot be transferred to another individual
 - An account can be associated to multiple tax identification numbers (TINs)

IACS Overview (cont.)

- For a PQRS GPRO user to access the WI, IACS accounts must be associated with the **GPRO TIN**
- For an ACO user to access the WI, IACS accounts must be associated with the **ACO Primary TIN** used when registering for the ACO program
- If your organization and users reported data via the GPRO Web Interface in a previous program year, your existing IACS accounts may be utilized
 - You will need to ensure your account is still active

IACS Roles

- There are two different roles required to be able to submit data in the GPRO WI:
 - PQRS Security Official Role
 - PQRS Submitter Role
- The Security Official Role must be set up for your group in order to approve the Submitter Role

Security Official Role

- There is one Security Official (SO) for your group
- The SO will approve roles for the data submitters in your group including:
 - PQRS Submitter Role in IACS
 - GPRO Submission 2013 or ACO Submission 2013 role within the PQRS QualityNet Roles Management System (QRMS)
- The SO cannot submit data for your group in the WI
- If you already have an SO for your group, they should make sure their account is active, if it is not, they should follow the steps in IACS to reactivate

NOTE: This SO role is different than the SO role used for PV-PQRS registration

I don't have an IACS Account I'm a New Security Official

- If your Organization is not setup in IACS for PQRS, your SO will first need to set up your Organization in IACS (<https://applications.cms.hhs.gov/>)
 - **NOTE:** This SO role is different than the SO role used for PV-PQRS registration
- Once your request is submitted, the QualityNet help desk will contact the SO to request verification documentation
- CMS approved IRS documentation used to set up your Organization includes:
 - CP 575, Letter 147C, Form 9787, CP 225, Letter 2645C, CP 210, CP 267, CP 403, CP 2100A, CP 504, Letter 387C, Letter 2782C
 - The IRS document must be on IRS letterhead and include your Organization's address and TIN/EIN

PQRS Submitter Role

- This role is for GPRO / ACO users accessing the Web Interface and submitting data in the Web Interface
- The group SO approves the PQRS Submitters for the group
- There can be multiple PQRS Submitters for your group

NOTE: This submitter role is different than the submitter role used for PV-PQRS registration

What do I need to do to submit data via 2013 GPRO WI?

If you...	You need to...
Participated in GPRO WI submission last year	Make sure your IACS account is still active. If it is not, you need to reactivate it.
Are a new GPRO user in 2013 and do not have an IACS account	Register for an IACS account with the PQRS Submitter role, under the GPRO TIN. Once approved in IACS, request the GPRO Submission 2013 role within the PQRS Portal. -Slide 13
Are a new ACO user in 2013 and do not have an IACS account	Register for an IACS account with the PQRS Submitter role, under the <u>ACO Primary TIN</u> . Once approved in IACS, request the ACO Submission 2013 role within the PQRS Portal. -Slide 13
Are a new GPRO user in 2013 and have an IACS account	Make sure you have the IACS PQRS Submitter role for your TIN. If you do not, you may have to go through additional verification to obtain that role. <u>NOTE: This is not the same role used to register for PQRS GPRO.</u> -Slide 14
Are a new ACO user in 2013 and have an IACS account	Make sure you have the PQRS Submitter role with IACS associated with your <u>ACO Primary TIN</u> . You will then need to request the ACO Submission 2013 role with the PQRS Portal. Slide 14

I don't have an IACS Account I'm a New Web Interface User

- You need an IACS account to access the WI
- Go to the CMS Applications Portal URL:
 - <https://applications.cms.hhs.gov/>
- Follow the steps to set up an account
- Contact the QualityNet Help Desk if you have any questions about setting up your IACS account

I have an existing IACS account

- Within IACS you must ensure your account
 - Has the PQRS Submitter role
 - Is associated with your Organization
- Within the PQRS Portal Roles Management System you must request
 - GPRO Submission 2013 (for GPROs)
 - ACO Submission 2013 (for ACOs)

NOTE: This submitter role is different than the submitter role used for PV-PQRS registration

GPRO or ACO Submission 2013 Role

- First ensure you have your IACS account created with the PQRS Submitter role, and also associated to your Organization (GPRO TIN or ACO Primary TIN)
- Next login to the PQRS Portal Roles Management application
 - Request the GPRO Submission 2013 role (GPRO) or ACO Submission 2013 role (ACO)

Maintaining Your IACS Account

- You must renew your password every 60 days
- If your account expires, you must follow the instructions within IACS to reactivate your account
