**SUBJECT:** 60-day Comment Period for Integrated Annual Notice of Changes and Evidence

of Coverage for Dual Eligible Special Needs Plans in Certain States

## **Purpose**

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is announcing an opportunity for dual eligible special needs plans (D-SNPs) that are applicable integrated plans (AIPs) (as defined at 42 CFR 422.561)<sup>1</sup>, and other partners to comment on the proposed Integrated Annual Notice of Changes (ANOC) and Evidence of Coverage (EOC). Comments are due by November 7, 2022.

## **Background**

As required by §§ 422.2267(e) and 423.2267(e), all Medicare Advantage and Part D plans must provide the EOC to current and prospective enrollees as well as an ANOC to current enrollees. Per §§ 422.2265(c) and 423.2265(c) plans must also post the ANOC and EOC to their websites.

As noted in our May 2022 final rule,<sup>2</sup> for enrollees whose Medicare and Medicaid benefits are covered under AIPs, there are advantages to receiving communications that integrate all of the required Medicare and Medicaid content including providing a more seamless description of health care coverage and enhancing the understanding of, and satisfaction with, the coverage both programs provide.

Through the Paperwork Reduction Act (PRA) clearance process, we are creating versions of the CY 2024 ANOC and EOC for AIPs in states that require such plans to issue integrated ANOC and EOC materials. These integrated versions will reflect revisions to the existing D-SNP ANOC and EOC templates<sup>3</sup> to include integrated information on Medicaid benefits that state Medicaid agencies can customize.

We request comment from D-SNPs and other partners on the readability of these documents for enrollees and ease of integrating Medicaid information for states and AIPs. Once we make updates based on these comments, we will post the documents for an additional 30-day comment period along with the Spanish and Chinese language versions of the integrated ANOC and EOC.
