

The Inflation Reduction Act is lowering prescription drug costs and bringing relief to people with Medicare.

Some benefits that people with Medicare can expect include:



\$35 per month (or less) for each Medicare-covered insulin product



Free recommended preventive vaccines with Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage—includes shingles, RSV, & Tdap



In January 2025, out-of-pocket prescription drug costs will be capped at **\$2,000** for everyone with Medicare Part D



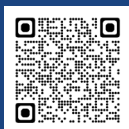
Drug companies must **pay a rebate** to Medicare if they raise drug prices faster than inflation



New, lower prices in 2026 for 10 selected drugs through Medicare negotiations with participating drug companies; additional drugs will be selected for new negotiations every year
